The Thistle Farms comprehensive model offers hope and healing through a holistic residential program, employment within a social enterprise and a growing national and global network dedicated to changing a culture that allows human beings to be bought and sold. Jasmine Road has joined the Thistle National Network which is a community of over 40 sister organizations driving systemic change by connecting survivors of prostitution, trafficking, addiction and abuse to healing and empowerment. The goal of this national model is to equip survivors to lead and have profound local impact.

We have made a commitment to these three basic principals:

Housing: Free long-term housing without live-in staff

Healing: Free comprehensive physical and mental healthcare

Employment: Connection to a safe, sustainable income

Why Take Action?

95% OF VICTIMS IN LIVES OF PROSTITUTION EXPERIENCED SEXUAL ABUSE AS CHILDREN. (AVA INFORMATION BRIEFING - PROSTITUTION AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE RESEARCH)

THE AVERAGE AGE AT WHICH GIRLS FIRST BECOME VICTIMS OF PROSTITUTION IS 12 to 14. (FBI WEBSITE)

TOO OFTEN, GIRLS ARE CRIMINALIZED FOR BEHAVIORS THAT ARE NATURAL RESPONSES TO TRAUMA SUCH AS RUNNING AWAY OR SELF-MEDICATING THROUGH SUBSTANCE ABUSE. IN THE WORST CASES THEY ARE BEING ARRESTED AND CHARGED WITH PROSTITUTION DESPITE THEIR BEING VICTIMS OF CHILD SEX TRAFFICKING. (RIGHTS4GIRLS FACT SHEET)
